BIOGRAPHY

A MULTI-HYPHENATE CREATIVE

A producer, director, and production designer, Rana has industry-acclaimed credits in televised and large-scale events for Bravo Media, TIME Inc., NBC Universal, SONY, The WEBBY's, MLB, FOX, The Public Theater, and the Tribeca Film Festival. An award-winning, classically trained vocalist, composer, actor, writer, and former model for Calvin Klein and Ralph Lauren, she has workshopped with Sundance Films Director's Lab under <u>Carlin Glynn</u>, and performed and directed Off-Broadway. She has trained in NY with celebrated director <u>Travis Preston</u> at the New School during its collaboration with The Actors Studio, and in LA with Emmy-winning director <u>Joan Darling</u>. Rana was Artistic Director of Manhattan's developmental theater the Birdhouse Players and the Aerie Rep, directing all creative departments of main stage productions and training hundreds of actors to careers in the arts (including her own children). Rana is also co-founder of The <u>Sled</u>, a non-profit providing crisis support for housing-insecure NYC public school students and their families. She has been awarded distinctions for her charitable work by NYC's Dept of Ed, Project Open Arms, and the <u>NY Stock Exchange</u>.

Rana has composed and recorded original and commissioned works, arranged compositions for discography, and produced and recorded her solo album titled, Violet. Her original composition, The TinyTllda's Lament (for which she penned a comedic skit) was performed by the Broadway stars of Matilda the Musical at 54 Below under her direction and with her choreography. Rana is currently writing music, lyrics, and book for a new musical titled, Spindlequick.

While performing as Sarah Brown in a western tour of Guys and Dolls, producers of the musical sought to honor a colleague who had recently lost a battle with ovarian cancer. Rana volunteered to chair the effort, producing a gala in her honor to benefit the <u>National Ovarian Cancer Coalition</u>. Coordinating not only logistics and travel of NOCC members and administrators from across the country to Denver, Rana endeavored further to raise awareness of the newly-national organization by branding and executing the NOCC's national quilt campaign, its gala fundraiser, and an accompanying benefit concert, Spotlight on a Cure (at which she also performed).

It was the first event Rana produced in what would ultimately become the second stage of her creative career.

Incorporating under Deccan Design Prods, Rana professionally produced and conceptually designed large-scale private and corporate events, concerts, and theatricals. She formed professional partnerships with world-renowned floral designer Michael George (under the banner, Deccan George), and creatively directed projects for Empire Entertainment for over a decade. These events and their associated corporate campaigns were recognognized with industry awards and acclaim, elevating clients' global brands and raising expectations for immersive, inventive functions. With acquired expertise and her lifelong performance skills, Rana then forged a developmental theater, recruiting her team of technical professionals and Equity creatives to annually stage main stage musicals and plays, while offering conservatory training in acting, improv, voice, music production, and recording in off-seasons.






CONVICTION

Rana's extraordinary experience with the Tankleff case was formative and profound. It inspires her commitment to serve those in need and to pursue justice and dignity through year-round charitable work.

▽ Social Justice to Service

In 2003, blockbuster new exculpatory evidence surfaced in the case of Marty Tankleff, who was convicted in 1990 for the murders of his parents. But the Suffolk County DA refused to investigate the new evidence and aggressively opposed a hearing. A public pressure campaign was undertaken by Soury Communications in coordination with his lawyers. Rana (now a producer who had previously worked two years as a paralegal at Clifford Chance) joined the four person PR team, and worked pro-bono over the next 5 years on the public campaign to Free Marty. She brought invaluable insight and a ready, intricate, and direct knowledge of the complicated case: Marty Tankleff was Rana's high school boyfriend. At 15 years old, her careful, real-time study of presented evidence and witness testimony led her and her family to support his innocence through his convictions and incarceration.

Team Tankleff's PR effort's led CBS 48 Hours to produce five full shows on the Tankleff case; their coverage was joined by every major local and national news outlet, from the Wall Street Journal, the New York Times, CNN, to The Oprah Winfrey Show. James Gandolfini became spokesman for a cause that reached media, supporters, and the legal community in 5 continents. The campaign to Free Marty succeeded. After 17.5 years of wrongful imprisonment, he was exonerated and released in December 2007. His lead counsel immediately asked Rana to produce a NYC gala to celebrate his freedom. The following September, she staged "Marty Gras" - a riff off the Free Marty Campaign - at NYC's <u>Angel Orensanz Foundation</u>. Covered by the media, the gala featured catering by supporter and morning news anchor, Rosanna <u>Scotto's</u> family restaurant, appearances by James Gandolfini and Innocence Project cofounder <u>Barry Scheck</u>, and performances by the star of the 2007 remake of Hairspray, <u>Nikki Blonsky</u> and Rana, herself (accompanied by notable New Orlean's jazz band leader, Bill Malchow).

Co-founding the Sled in 2019, Rana has served thousands of New York public school students and families who are temporarily housed or living below the poverty line. Year round, the Sled provides urgent, specifically requested emergency needs within 2-3 days upon referral from school and welfare officials. During the holidays, the Sled delivers thousands of the exact, hoped-for holiday gift wishes requested by students who would otherwise go without. Featured on NBC, CNN, CNBC, and WPIX, the Sled and Rana has been awarded for service from the DOE, Project Open Arms, and the NYSE.
